

Advanced Scheduling Strategies (especially during Covid-19) for PM's and Field Supervision

The project schedule can be our most valuable tool – or our Achilles heel.

Today's complex world of construction, combined with a pandemic, is causing the "throttle" on schedules to be unpredictable. One day a project might be paused, stopped, or slowed, then accelerated, and compressed. All of this is requiring teams to do more with less. To make matters more complicated, we are forced into aggressive contracts that shift all risk to the contractor and subcontractors; including forces we have no control over. How do we react? Can our project schedule help or potentially hurt us? This session will focus on "blocking and tackling" techniques that project teams can incorporate into their schedules. It will also highlight the terms and legal "mumbo jumbo" each PM or superintendent should understand concerning project schedules. Pandemic or not, these skills are practical on any project.
